enter for Girls Foundation's mission is to work within the Chiang Rai Province to empower women and children, reduce instances of gender-based violence (GBV), and educate the populace about human trafficking issues. CFG seeks to prevent the commercial sexual exploitation of children (CSEC) and all forms of abuse against children. We are committed to creating sustainable, participatory projects that equip people in the surrounding communities with the necessary life skills to become independent

leaders who strive towards human rights for all, regardless of gender, age, race, ethnicity, nationality, religion, or socioeconomic status.

The "Project to Empower the Community and Develop Local Mechanisms for the Protection of Children" funded by Kindernothilfe will help protect children in 3 border districts in Chiang Rai, Thailand from all forms of violence and we are very excited to expand our work in two new districts (Chiang Saen and Wiang Kaen) through this program.

The impact of the pandemic spreads far beyond the physical health of our community, causing economic impacts, school closures, draining programmatic resources, and can lead to an increase in gender-based violence while creating barriers to accessing essential help and services. This makes our work even more important and we are grateful for all our our partners who continue to support this important, life changing work.



Women's Economic Empowerment and Livelihoods Development

U.N. Women

Goal | To economically empower women affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and gender-based violence in Chiang Khong District, strengthening their financial literacy skills and ability to earn their own income.

Project | In 2021, we designed training curriculum to empower women, prevent human trafficking, and improve the socio-economic and livelihoods opportunities in Chiang Khong. The Center for Girls Foundation provided women with valuable training on financial literacy as well as the production of high-quality, sustainably made soaps, product packaging and photography, and online marketing.

Impact | 56 women from four villages attended these valuable trainings. Participants learned how to develop a financial savings plan for their own households. They also developed the ability to create cold-pressed soaps utilizing home-grown agricultural products, learned how to creatively package their soaps, and to market these products online to generate revenue.

Empowering the Community and Developing Local Protection of Children

Kindernothilfe

Goal | In partnership with KNH, the Center for Girls Foundation works to ensure that children in three border districts (Chiang Khong, Chiang Saen, and Wiang Kaen) are safe from all forms of violence. We help local communities build systems that prevent, promote, and protect the rights and welfare of children through a participatory approach, keeping children's needs and the larger community at the center of our work.

Project | This year, we adapted to the ongoing pandemic by taking many of our trainings and workshops online. We created a forum for children to share their experiences and a process in which children learn through tools and methods that are age and context appropriate, including small group discussions and using media and technology for activities and online communication. The Center for Girls Foundation also works with important community representatives from 7 sub-districts, including Wiang, Sathan, Sri Don Chai, Bun Rueang, Huai So, and Krueng in Chiang Khong district as well as Mae Ngoen in Chiang Saen District to develop knowledge and understanding about child's rights, types of violence against children, and their own role in ending violence against children.

Impact | In 2021, KNH's partnership made it possible for the Center for Girls Foundation to conduct programs in 11 target areas, reaching 200 community representatives through two trainings, where they received information on child rights and child protection and bolstered their ability to detect and report abuses. Despite COVID-19 restrictions that made it difficult to organize and gather, 17 Local Administrative Organizations partnered with us in 2021 to establish the child protection committee which will continue to defend the rights of children in the community for years to come. Further, we recruited 45 youth leaders in 2021 and established safety networks in 3 border districts, bolstering the ability to detect and properly intervene in cases where children are in danger.

Responding to Emergency Cases

Individual Donations

Goal | We fundraise to ensure we can respond quickly in times of crisis and are able to provide the help that members of our community need, exactly when the need it most. We are a resource and provide essential assistance to children, women, and families who are subjected to, or at risk of, any form of violence or sexual exploitation.

Project | Center For Girls Foundation is notified when cases of violence against women and children or human trafficking occur in our area. Our network consists of community leaders, local government officials, individuals in the private sector like restaurant owners and tuk tuk drivers, and members of the community who know they can rely on us. We provide assistance like basic essentials for children and families, safe housing, supporting education, transportation for medical or mental health care, preparation for litigation and navigating the legal process, and coordinate referrals to other organizations as well.

Impact | In 2021, the Center for Girls Foundation assisted 47 children, women, and families subjected to violence, including 29 children under the age of 18 (7 boys, 22 girls) and 18 adults aged 18 and over (1 male, 17 females). These cases consisted of physical and verbal abuse against both women and children, child pregnancy, and exploitation on the internet where victims were deceived into transfering money online under false pretenses.

Social Empowerment for Gender Equality

Diakonia

Goal | Through Diakonia's support of our Social Empowerment For Gender Equality Project, the Center for Girls Foundation provides women with the tools they need to become strong leaders by increasing their knowledge, awareness, and skills. Together, we advocate for public policy change, promote gender equality, and work to reduce violence against women and children in Chiang Khong District.

Project | In 2021, the Center for Girls Foundation worked closely with the network of women leaders in our community that we have been building since 2016. 35 representatives from 209 women leaders drafted strategies to improve the health, economic, social and cultural, and environmental issues they face, as well as working to promote gender equality and reduce violence against women and children. These strategies will be used as a roadmap to drive the work over the next two years of this project.

Impact | We are seeing an important shift in the attitudes around female leadership in our community as a direct result of this work with 96.2% of women we worked with reporting that they believe women can

work as community leaders (a 20%+ increase in just one year). 208 women leaders from 102 villages who participated in the Women for Change project from 2016-2020 have continued their partnership with the Center for Girls Foundation, many of whom are running for elected office in their village or district. In the 2021 elections, 36 women were elected to positions as village head-person, village head-person assistant, council member, chief of the Local Administration Organization (compared to 2020, when only three women were elected into these positions).

"**Sopa Soap**" becomes available in stores in Chiang Khong! In 2020, we hosted **soap making workshops**, teaching women how to make and sell their own soaps, providing a **new source of income for women**, including those who lost jobs due to COVID-19 closures and restrictions.

Sponsored by Diakonia, the Center for Girls Foundation convenes our **network of local leaders** to empower women, drive gender equality, and improve our health, economic, social, cultural, and environmental priorities.

In this busy month we hosted workshops on: financial savings for local women; with women leaders to review lessons learned from Women for Change; to discuss the Social Empowerment for Gender Equality project; and on child's rights, protection, law, and policy.



On November 25, the International Day to End Violence against Women, we **kicked off 16 Days of Activism to stand against gender-based violence**.



In early December we hosted an awareness training **sponsored by KNH**. We convened many different sectors and focused on **community-level child protection**, coming together to prioritize the work to protect children in our community. Sukanya was born and raised in Ban Sopsom, Chiang Khong District and as the major, she oversees 5 villages in the Wiang Chiang Khong District.

Coming into this position was both very exciting and challenging for Sukanya. As a local leader, Sukanya is dedicated to promoting people's quality of life and creating a suitable and safe environment within her community.

For Sukanya, the safety and wellbeing of children is one of her biggest priorities. After working with the Center for Girls Foundation around child protection, she agrees that it is the municipality's duty to protect children. Sukanya is continually focused on promoting the development of children of all ages and genders through both education and strengthening of child protection laws.

She works closely with the Center for Girls Foundation and the sub-district's child protection committee, and has helped develop the Wiang Chiang Khong District's child protection center that is responsible for reporting incidents and cases of violence against children, helping and assisting children who have been subjected to violence, and planning awareness campaigns aimed to promote understanding among parents. Sukanya believes that violence against children is not a personal issue but a problem that everyone has the shared responsibility of eradicating.

As a mayor, Ms. Tipruaksa is dedicated to continuing to work hard to ensure the protection of children as well as promote the knowledge and skills necessary to protect the entire community from all forms of violence and exploitation.


